The Story of Jesus' Birth

Joseph and Mary are walking slowly with their donkey trailing behind them.

Joseph: Mary, this donkey is useless. I told you we should have got the horse.

Mary: Oh Joseph, leave him alone. There's no way he could carry me now!

Joseph: Well it looks as though I'll be carrying *him* soon if we don't find somewhere to stay.

Mary: What about this place?

Joseph: It says 'No Vacancies'.

Mary: Maybe they can find a place for us.

Joseph knocks on the door.

Inn Keeper: What do you want?!

Mary: We need a place to stay, I am about to have a baby.

Inn Keeper: Can't you read? We are full! Now go away!

The Inn Keeper slams the door.

Joseph: Well, I can't see him staying in business very long!

Peasant: Excuse me, I couldn't help but over hear. I have a place that you could stay. It isn't much, but it's warm and there's plenty of hay to lie on.

Mary: Thank you that sounds wonderful!

The peasant begins to lead Joseph and Mary to his barn.

Joseph: Hay? What do you mean, hay?

Elf 1: So, Mary and Joseph found a place to rest for the night and shelter from the cold.

Elf 2: And what about the baby?

Elf 1: It was born in a manger that night. They named him Jesus.

Mary: Isn't he just beautiful, Joseph? I think he is really going to be someone special.

Joseph: I think you might be right, Mary.

Song: *Away in a Manger*

Three shepherds are watching their sheep.

Shepherd 1: I can't believe we're on the night shift again.

Shepherd 2: I know! You'd think there would be an easier way to protect these sheep.

Shepherd 3: Hey! Look at those stars – they seem to be getting brighter!

Three angels appear before the shepherds.

Shepherd 1: They're not stars – they're angels.

Angel 1: Don't be afraid.

Angel 2: We bring you good news.

Angel 3: Tonight, in Bethlehem, a baby has been born.

Shepherd 2: Well, please pass on our congratulations to the parents. Unfortunately, we have sheep to watch.

Angel 1: You do not understand. This baby is particularly special.

Angel 2: It is said that he will be the one to save the world.

Shepherd 3: Oh wow. Well, in that case we better go and visit!

Angel 3: Follow the star – it will lead you to him.

Angel 1: You will know this baby because he will be wrapped in cloths and laying in a manger.

The angels exit.

Song: The First Noel

Shepherd 1: Does everyone know the news?

Shepherd 2: I think it's just us.

Shepherd 3: We better go and spread the word!

Shepherd 1: What about the sheep?

Shepherd 2: Oh, let's just leave them, what's the worst that could happen?

Song: Go Tell It on the Mountain

The three wise men, the shepherds and the angels are all gathered around Mary, Joseph and Jesus in the manger.

Shepherd 3: Look at the wise men - I told you we should have brought gifts!

Shepherd 1: Nothing was open at this hour of night. Just forget about it.

Wise man 1: We have brought gifts for the son of God. I have brought gold.

Wise man 2: I have brought Frankincense.

Wise man 3: And I have brought Myrrh.

Mary: Thank you for your lovely gifts.

Shepherd 2: (*quietly to Shepherd 3*) For wise men, you'd think they would bring more appropriate gifts for a baby...

Song: We Three Kings

Elf 2: So, is the 25th of December really Jesus' birthday?

Elf 1: Well, probably not.

Elf 2: Why do we celebrate it on that date then?

Elf 1: Well the 25th of December is as good a date as any other.

Elf 2: I guess so. But if the 25th of December is when we celebrate the birth of Jesus, what does Santa have to do with that? Is it just a coincidence that he brings us presents the night before?

Elf 1: Ah... good question. I think Grandpa Jim tells this story best. Let's watch and find out...

Grandpa Jim: Come on children, gather round – I have a story to tell you.

Child 1: Is it about fairies?

Grandpa Jim: No, but it is about magic.

Child 2: Is it Harry Potter?!

Grandpa Jim: No, but it is about a very special and kind man.

Child 3: Is it about Santa?

Grandpa Jim: Why yes, it is.

Children look at each other excitedly. The story is acted out/mimed while Grandpa Jim narrates (story can be read from a book).

Grandpa Jim: Once upon a time, hundreds of years ago, there lived a man named Nicholas. He came from a very wealthy family but he knew that others were not so lucky.

There was a very poor family with three daughters that lived in the same village as Nicholas. One night, when the girls were sleeping, Nicholas came and dropped three bags of gold down the chimney. The girls had hung their stockings out to dry by the fireplace that night and when they woke up, they found the gifts inside their stockings.
